- 1.a.4 Chrysanthemums – Three stems spray any variety
- 1.a.5 Chrysanthemums – One specimen bloom any variety
- 1.a.6 Gladiolus – One specimen bloom any variety
- 1.a.7 Five stems annuals

b) Pot Plants

- 1.b.1 House plant in bloom
- 1.b.2 Foliage house plant
- 1.b.3 Specimen cactus or succulent
- 1.b.4 Bush or shrub with edible parts grown in a pot

2. Floral Art

a) Novice – space allowed 75cm x 60cm x 100cm

- 2.b.3 “A TOUCH OF SPARKLE” – A petite exhibit – Not to exceed 25cms in width, depth and height. This measurement does not apply to the diagonal measurement.
